- The microbrew and niche restaurant scene in Oceanside is great; the City should leverage this phenomenon to encourage other compatible businesses to locate in the City.
- The San Luis Rey NPA affords great scenic views of the SLR River, Camp Pendleton wildland, mountain ranges to the north and east, etc; infill and redevelopment in this NPA should be sensitive to scenic views.
- Traffic congestion on Hwy 76 and major intersections detracts from quality-of-life; the City needs to improve traffic flow on Hwy 76 and provide other mobility options.
- The SLR NPA is home to many seniors and veterans. These residents bring stability to the neighborhood and should be respected and supported.
- The El Corazon Senior Center and Aquatics Center are great amenities; the City should consider shuttle service to El Corazon.
- Heritage Park is a great amenity. The City should do more to promote it.
- Many see Oceanside as lacking culture; the City should promote cultural venues, public art, and events that connect residents to art, history, and other inspirational content.
- The City should enhance habitat restoration in the Whelan Lake area and consider implementing a trail system.
- The skydiving operation at the airport generates disruptive noise.
- The intersection of Mission Avenue and Douglas Drive lack visual appeal; the City should looks for ways to enhance the appearance of the public right-of-way in this area.
- The City should enhance the gateway signage that announces the SLR Historic District.
- Mira Costa College is a great neighborhood amenity, providing educational and recreational opportunities for local residents.
- The Mira Costa NPA is very family-oriented, which contributes to its safety, stability, and visual quality.
